#### TIYC NOTABLE HISTORIC DATES by George C. Knies, Life Member

**1933** Commenced building Bridges

**<u>1936</u>** November the Bay Bridge opened

1937 May 27 Golden Gate Bridge opened

**<u>1938</u>** TI landfill completed TI: 40 acres 1 mile long by 2/3-mile wide 13 ft. sea level

<u>1939-1940</u>. Golden Gate International Expo opened. Jan 23 PAA (Pan American Airlines) moved from Alameda to TI

1941 Transferred to Navy

1944 PAA moved to mills field

1966 TI Naval Sailing Association formed

**<u>1985</u>** George Knies incorporated club as at 501 (C)7 Not for Profit Corp.... TIYC, Inc.

**1985** 46<sup>th</sup> "Nimitz Matches" US PAC FEET vs. Olympic Club Team Racing. The matches started in 1933 and were held every year except for the WWII years until '85 when the ACLU brought action against the Olympic Club because women were denied membership.

**1992** TIYC conducted the International Sunfish Championships sponsored by United Air Lines.

**<u>1993</u>** July 12 first BRAC Base Closure/Transition Committee.

**<u>1995</u>** Jul 5 the City formed the Base Redevelopment Board/Redevelopment Agency and the Citizens Reuse Committee: Names to remember: Larry Florin, Eddie Bartolo Jr. (49ers), Ron Burkle, Port Director Doug Wong, etc.

**1997** Sep. 30 The NAVSTA was officially closed..... On Oct 18 Gov Pete Wilson signed legislation that made Willie Brown one-man Czar of TI. Willie then moved his former concubine the ever-popular Wendy Linka into former High Ranking Officer quarters on YBI. Thus commenced the never-ending saga of SF PCCF (Political Correctness, Confusion and Frustration).

**<u>1997 o date</u>** Ejected from our club house. Turned the former MWR sail locker and engine shop into our present home, sans running water.

<u>General:</u> 1979 – 1993 TIYC conducted the Navy Central Pacific Team Racing Championship Regattas, as well as Small Boat Racing Association Regional Regattas in Clipper Cove. Currently conducting annual PICYA CHISPA and Youth Regattas

"I was pretty much given free reign to do the things that needed to be done in trying to make the club a better organization. I cleaned out the two storage containers used at the time for keeping extra sails and gear. Much of it was tossed, since it had been in there for years, was moldy and forgotten, and the rest put on an inventory. The Navy Special Services ran the docks at the time and had six rental Rhodes 19 keel day sailors, as I recall. I worked with Special Services to get all the boats refitted, repainted and generally made seaworthy again in order that the TIYC could use them for racing when not being rented out to Navy and Marine personnel. Racing at the time was done against other Naval bases and stations. When Navy personnel came from other bases, we used our boats. When we went to other Naval installations, we used their boats. In order to make the draw of boats fair, we either rotated boats (some were better than others) each race or drew straws for a boat."

"I made up turn over binders for each elected club officer, but that kind of went by the wayside after I left. I also initiated a reciprocal yacht club program with other clubs around the Bay and further out. Since our cove was one of the most popular spots for cruise ins, we had watch standers during those days, too, and offered our facility for parties, etc."

"Towards the end of my tour, I was a participant in the planning for the renovation of the club house (now some sort of restaurant...) with the U.S. Navy. It was really a nice place and it upsets me to know that it was taken away..."

"All in all, I thoroughly enjoyed my year as Commodore."
