## Recollections of Past Commodore Sandra Aberer concerning TIYC address history-

When the US Post Office was closed on Treasure Island the mailing address of the Yacht Club became an issue. Treasure Island Yacht Club was assigned a mailing address of 198 First Street, San Francisco, CA 94130. Confusion followed with mail being sent to 198 First Street, downtown SF. Members payments never arrived, bills sent to the Club were not received. Some mail was returned to the sender, some vanished either way irate providers and overdue members became a real problem. Imagine asking members NOT to mail their dues and vendors to forgive late payments due to USPS confusion. The Marina was having a similar problem but were able to change the number of their address to 1 First Street which did NOT work.

After contacting our mail carrier and USPS San Francisco, the Postmaster's Office in SF received both phone and written request to rectify the situation. Each time it was suggested that our mail was incorrectly addressed and a variety of different address formats given. Enclosed are a few of the address variations we were asked to use.

Over a year of struggle until the "Address Management System (ADS)" office was discovered. A very understanding employee announced that she was the ONE person who could change an address but she was going on vacation immediately. Eventually a most unusual conversation took place while I was Commodore.

ADS suggested Marina for street name. I suggested Clipper Cove.

ADS asked for a complete name, perhaps Circle, Road, Lane, Boulevard, Street. Since none of these seemed to fit, my suggestion was "Way".

ADS then suggested since Almar had arranged 1 First Street perhaps we'd like to be 2 First Street. My concern was that expansion of the cafe or another building might necessitate the need for #2. Not wanting the expense of printing new address information should changes happen I suggested a higher number.

ADS gave me a choice of any even number from 2 - 98. Since the Treasure Island Yacht Club was founded in 1966, I opted for 66.

I took a deep breath after hanging up the phone, when the realization that the conversation had created a new street name, suffix, and number out of the clear.

Even more surprising was that the enclosed test letters all arrived at TIYC after ADS worked it's magic. Never again have we had trouble getting mail at the Club.

UNFORTUNATELY, the SF Fire Department (paramedics included) and Police records still are unaware of 66 Clipper Cove. Anyone willing to take on getting their records updated?

### AC34 Bay Area Yacht Club Alliance

Sailing enthusiasts from around the San Francisco Bay area came together to provide crucial time and support for the AC45 test sessions June 13-20 on San Francisco Bay.

As the host location of the event, Golden Gate Yacht Club was instrumental in spearheading the alliance between the Bay Area clubs, as well as supported all of the on-the-water activity.

# Proposed AC34 Courses



On Wednesday, 14 December, 2011 I had the privilege of attending a special briefing by John Craig, Principal Race Officer AC 84 at the Oakland Yacht Club. I have been privy to initial planning being conducted by the Coast Guard regarding their **SLR** (Special Local Regulations) "Operation Order" for this event, which is a monumental task; basically the operation will duplicate their "Fleet Week" plan plus having to accommodate a greater spectator fleet. As of this writing the **SLR** is being reviewed at Coast Guard Headquarters and will be published

Since this article is appearing in boating community publications I will address the specific diversions from past racing rules and interesting innovations prompted by the racing craft being used in the "World Series" then the Louis Vuitton and the Cup Race.

**World Series** Traveling the world using a modified container ship that carries the - AC45's, Race Committee Boat, Mark Boats, Marshall's Boats, Safety Boats, Emergency Boats, etc.

**On-the-Water Training** - for approximately 60 volunteer boats and crews (CG Auxiliary and Yacht Club assets) will be conducted February 11-12 and 18-19. It is anticipated that 30 of these assets will be used per day. These assets are in addition to the Race Management boats, Blue Lights and other Safety/Emergency resources.

**Rule Changes:**

- Contact with other boats including the Race Committee Boat, Signal Boat and Mark Boats is not an automatic disqualifier.

Outside assistance for raising a capsized boat is allowed.

**2011 Site Management Plan**

**December 2011 update**

**In the latest version of the final report the status of Clipper Cove was mentioned and the schedule was provided.**

**SITE 27 – CLIPPER COVE SKEET RANGE**

Site 27, located in Clipper Cove, is situated directly between TI and YBI. Between 1979 and 1989, a portion of Clipper Cove was used as a naval skeet range. Naval personnel fired lead shot over the water as clay skeet targets were launched from the shoreline. In 1993, the Clipper Cove Skeet Range was identified as a potential environmental concern, based on the Regional Water Board Order No. 93-130 “Site Cleanup Requirements for NAVSTA TI Skeet Range.” In October 1993, the BCT agreed to comply with the Regional Water Board Order requirements through the CERCLA process and include the Clipper Cove Skeet Range in the Navy’s IR Program as Site 27 (Remedial Project Manager/BCT Meeting Minutes October 1993). In 1996, samples were collected at Site 27 to define the vertical and horizontal extent of lead shot, lead, and PAHs in the offshore sediments and overlying surface water. Additional investigation of lead and PAHs in the onshore soils of Site 27 was conducted under the EBS data gaps investigation in 2004. In September 2005, a hydrographic study was conducted to evaluate sedimentation rates and deposition in Clipper Cove. The results indicated steady-state conditions and sediment thickness may not be protective of diving ducks within 150 feet of the shoreline; therefore, an additional sediment investigation to characterize the distribution of lead shot in near-shore sediments was conducted in March 2008. The investigation indicated that lead shot is covered by only 1 foot of sediment in some near-shore locations. A revised FS report was finalized August 13, 2010.

The Navy prepared a site boundary change technical memorandum to exclude the upland portion of the site in support of property transfer. The boundary change was finalized on August 20, 2010. The PP/Draft RAP was finalized in June 2011 and a public meeting was held on June 14, 2011. A ROD/RAP is currently being prepared.

In 2006 Nancy was presented with the **Leadership in Women’s Sailing Award** sponsored by *BoatUS* and the *National Women’s Sailing Association*. The award honors a male or female who has built a record of achievement in inspiring, educating and enriching the lives of women through sailing.
