VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

February 25, 2008

House Improvements:

Storage Shed Shelves - Thanks again to Jim Aberer and his home improvement team (Don Mibach, Ray Zahnd & George Knies) for their hard work in building new shelves in the storage shed. This is a vast improvement and it is much easier to get around the BBQ grill.

Picnic Tables - The next project that they are looking at is the restoration of the picnic tables. We have the old frames but the wood was destroyed by dry rot. Jim will be getting a quote for pressure treated lumber. A question came up regarding where these will be placed and secured. This needs to be discussed at the February B&B meeting.

Adopt-A-Table - Many of the folding club tables are falling apart. Now is the time to start replacing them. In order to keep from straining our treasury it has been suggested that we have an "adopt-a-table" drive. The tables would be replaced with lighter, more durable plastic top tables. Donations would be solicited from the members and contributions would be acknowledged with the donor's name being affixed to the table they funded. To start this program, a sample 8' table has been purchased by Glenn & Mary Day Harter (honorary members) to replace one of the existing 8' tables. Checking pricing, the best deal is purchasing tables from Costco. They have two sizes:

- 1) Six foot, Lifetime Commercial brand, adjustable height (24", 29", 36") \$48.99 + tax & recognition plate. Member donation \$60.00 per table or \$30.00 per half table.
- 2) Four foot x 30", Lifetime Commercial brand, Utility table (not adjustable height) \$37.99 + tax & recognition plate. Member donation \$45.00 per table
