



1 August 79 We enjoyed a full house at our last heneral meeting. A record breaking 31 members were present! Where are the other one-hundred-twenty of you? Remember our next meeting will be held 20 August at 1930. Be sure to join us. Keys will again be available to the new door.

Mr. Weaver from Special Services joined us at our July meeting. He told us of the proposed plans for the new marina. Hopes are to have the project completed in two years. Included in the plans are 500 additional berths, a marine supply store, a convenience store, gas and diesel pumps, and a new Yacht club.

Did you know there are two boats available through Special Services for rent in addition to the Rhodes 19s. CANDIDA a 22ft. day sailer is available for free useage on the third weekend of each month and any day after 12 noon if it remains unattended. Arrangements can be made in the Harbor Master's Office, only qualified active duty and retired military personnel are authorized with a "B" Skipper's License.

The same qualifications must be met to rent the 25 ft. O'DAY Sailboat. She sleeps 5, has a galley equipped with an alcohol stove and includes a portable lavatory. There is a \$25.00 cleaning deposit, Available any day at \$12.00 for a 4hour period, \$20.00 from 0800 - 1600, \$25.00 from 0800 - 2000, and \$30.00 for a 24 hour period.

DO NOT FORGET TO MAKE RESERVATIONS FOR THE ANNUAL ANGEL ISLAND PICNIC. THE DEADLINE IS AUGUST 10th, 1979. CALL ROB OR MADELINE MC SHEEHYS AT (415) 731-7182 TO TELL THEM HOW MANY WILL BE IN YOUR PARTY.
