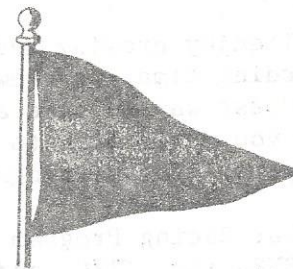

CAPT Gene Reddick, T.I. Recreation Director, our guest speaker at the March general meeting came forward with the following remarks:

1/ A complete, detailed, list of boat owners in the Marina will be provided the club just as soon as it can be compiled from the verification data requested of all Marina patrons.

2/ Dock lights are in process of being installed. Should be completed within the week. (i.e. on or before Apr 1st)

3/ Plans call for installation of gates at two entrances to Marina - to provide better security.

4/ Racing boat (ALCOHOLIC) will be retained one more time to see if Club will better utilize it, otherwise it will be moved to another club.

5/ Future plans call for providing utility to 20 ft. berths and increased electrical power to other piers.

6/ Combination locks will be purchased by Special Services and issued to all patrons for use on their dock lockers. Personal locks will not be permitted. This is to provide means for inspection of lockers to enforce fire regulations.

7/ Reason for requirement to submit verification data is to ensure that only authorized personnel are patrons.

8/ Requirements to pay berthing fees properly in advance will be enforced.

LEST YOU NOT FORGET --the next General Meeting will be held on Saturday, 19 April, 1200 hour, at the Marina Club House (trial basis only.) (NO MONDAY NITE MEETING ON APR 21.)
