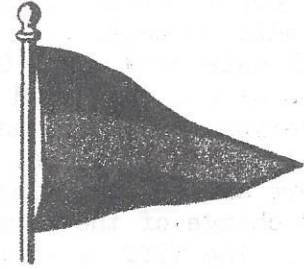

#### NOTES FROM THE RACING COMMODORE

THRILLS! EXCITEMENT! AND EDUCATION! All await the hardy souls who venture forth to race!

And to make it even more exciting mark your calendar in bold letters and numbers SATURDAY, 18 JULY 1981 for the FIRST ANNUAL PRESIDIO YACHT CLUB AND TREASURE ISLAND YACHT CLUB REGATTA.

#### AND NOW FOR THE DETAILS

Saturday, 18 July 1981, will be the first annual race between the TREASURE ISLAND YACHT CLUB and the PRESIDIO YACHT CLUB. The race will be held in the vicinity of the Olympic Circle. Because of special races being conducted by the Berkeley Yacht Club, we will not be able to use the circle itself. After the race, the two clubs will meet at TREASURE ISLAND YACHT CLUB HOUSE for a B-B-Q. During this GALA event, a five (5) year rotating trophy will be presented to the commodore of the VICTORIOUS yacht club. At the conclusion of the five (5) year period, the club which has won the trophy most often will keep it permanently.

The trophy will be awarded on the basis of the club with the highest number of points for the first ten boats to finish. Points will be in reverse order of finish with 10 points awarded to the winner, and 1 point awarded to 10th place.

#### RACE INFORMATION

The start line will be between the committee boat and YRA mark #14. There will be three starting groups. Each start group will be a mixture of boats from both clubs. Group 1 will include all boats with a handicap rating of 264 and above. Group 2 will be boats with ratings of 186 through 258. Group 3 will include all boats with ratings of 0 through 180. The race

warning will be at 1220. The preparation signal at 1225, and the first group starts at 1230. The next 2 groups will start at 1235 and 1240. Race results will be calculated on the basis of established handicaps. Each club will award points for their season series based on the relative finish of boats within their own club. This also applies to any trophies of each club.
