CHAPTER I: DUTIES OF CLUB OFFICERS

Section 1. The Commodore shall manage the affairs of the Club in accordance with the policies and directives of the Executive Committee.

He shall call special meetings of the Club, whenever he shall deem it necessary or upon the written request of 20% of the Voting members in good standing. He shall jointly with the Treasurer, execute all disbursements and such contracts as the Club may require. The Commodore shall be an ex-officio member of all committees.

Section 2. The Vice-Commodore shall assist the Commodore in the discharge of his duties and to officiate in his absence. He shall be chairman of the Membership Committee.

Section 3. The Qualifications Rear Commodore shall provide assistance to and coordinate with the Harbormaster in the Harbormaster's duty of determining the qualification level of authorized users of Naval Support Activity, Treasure Island Special Services rental boats. He shall use BUPERSINST Series 1710.10 as the minimum requirements. He shall be chairman of the Qualifications Committee.

Section 4. The Racing Rear Commodore shall be chairman of the standing Race Committee. He will direct racing activities of the Club.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep membership records and correspondence records of the Club and the minutes of all meetings.

Section 6. The Cruising Rear Commodore shall be chairman of the Cruising and Entertainment Committees.

Section 7. The Treasurer shall be custodian of the funds of the Club. He shall jointly with the Commodore, execute all disbursements and such contracts as the Club may require. Should the Club be officially dissolved, he will turn over all residual funds, in the Club Treasury to Special Services, U.S. Naval Support Activity, Treasure Island, designated to be used solely for the purchase of boats for Treasure Island.

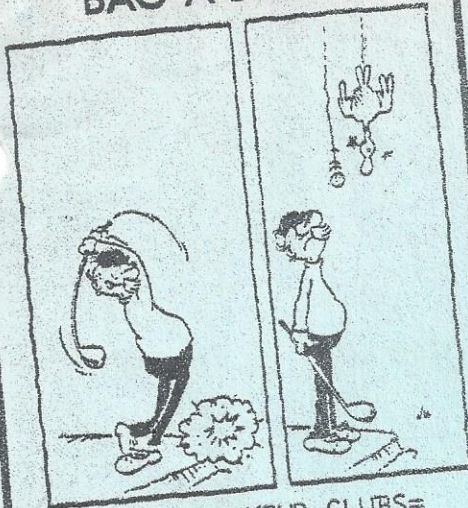

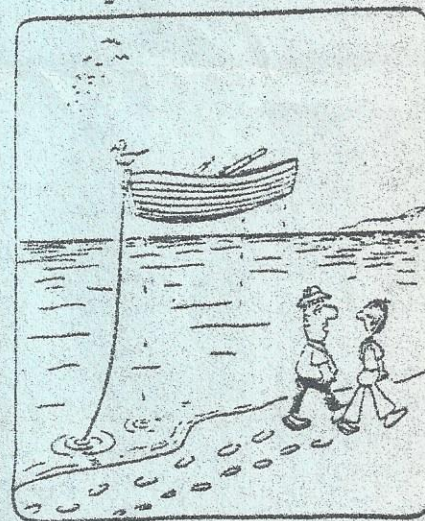
