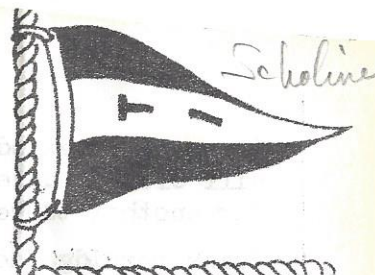

My sincere thanks to everyone for your contributions to this fine year. As I said at the November Dinner, our Bridge deserves our deep appreciation for jobs all very well done. Thank you Rob, June, Carl, Jim, Perry, Libby and Ken. You made it happen this year and we all enjoyed it.

In preparing our annual report to the U. S. Naval Sailing Association, I found some facts I want to pass along. This year, Treasure Island Yacht Club had 202 memberships of 315 individual members. We qualified over 170 Class "A" skippers in our basic sailing classes and 42 Class "B" skippers in an advanced class. We won the Bay Area Naval Sailing Association's Commandant's Cup and the ADM Van Arsdall Trophy. TIYC was host to the Navy Central Pacific Regional Sailing Championships and the sailing competition of the Navy-Olympic Club "Fleet Admiral Nimitz Pistol Matches.

Our boat owners raced in several club races and enjoyed club cruises. We even challenged Presidio Yacht Club to races, in the first of what will become an annual grudge match. We lost that first race, but I trust that we will win the Trophy back in 1982.

We welcomed the Canadian forces during both of their visits to San Francisco this year and have established freindly competition with them to carry on. The U. S. Pacific Fleet came to San Francisco for the first "Fleet Week" in 30 years, and TIYC went out to welcome the Nuclear Attack Submarine USS San Francisco, carrying some visiting sailors with us.

In addition to well attended monthly meetings, we gathered for dinners in March and November to share good food and good times. More than 100 members and guests enjoyed themselves at our annual picnic.

Now as fine a year as this was, I think next year can be even better. The new bridge will take over on New Years Day. Your new officers need your full support to provide activities for us all. When they ask for your help, don't hesitate to pitch in and do your part for the Club. I assure you that you'll get more in return than you give.

Open letter to TIYC members:

Hello. My name is Vi Finefrock and some members of the TIYC elected me as your new cruising vice commodore.

The following is utilized to help introduce myself. I have participated in many of the club activities and have had the opportunity of serving you as chairman and cochairman of several events held by TIYC. My husband, George, and I own the Dos Companeros.

I look forward to serving on the 1982 Bridge of the TIYC.

Now for the cruising program. To make the cruising program successful is my aim. But to make this a reality, I need your participation. This year's cruising program will be run a little different than it has in the past. A different chairman will be in charge of each cruise. This program is being initiated in order to have a more diversified cruise program relative to the ports that are visited, and to give all boat owners of all sizes as well as non-boat owners participation in deciding on the ports to visit. Please note: I said you do not have to own a boat to be a chairman on a cruise. However, you do have to get stowed on a boat to be chairman of a cruise. Any size boat may lead a cruise including the rounds. Cruise may be for half a day, all day, over-nighter, or double over-nighter. Cruises will be scheduled for every weekend following the general meeting. This is done to enable boat owners to get crews and for crews to find boat owners and also to discuss any last minute details relative to the cruise.

In addition to these cruises, there will be two 3-day cruises. You will find the schedule on the calendar that follows this news release. To decide where each of these cruises will be going, will require the names of people who are interested in taking the opportunity of managing the activities associated with cruising.

Attached please find an application form for both chairmen and co-chairmen. Co-chairmen are considered for last minute business trips for chairmen.

Some of the cruises are going to be coordinated with the Racing Commodore. For those that wish to participate in some fun\*racing, may do so.
