

FROM THE COMMODORE



The new **Jibe** format is the result of several changes made to enable the Bridge to bring you more timely, accurate, and interesting news about your Club. Most of the changes are

extensions of our recent efforts to conduct more of the Club's business by electronic means. In the "good ol" days", when the most critical decisions were whether or not to wear a sweater to the Clubhouse, we were able to conduct necessary business in a single monthly Bridge meeting, supplemented by short portions of the monthly general meetings to discuss matters for consideration by the members at large. Nowadays, we operate at a much more intense tempo. The impending base closure, and our transition to civilian control, are only part of the increased workload. We are engaged in a serious program of systematic re-examination of every aspect of the Club's operation to ensure that we can continue to be a viable presence in the San Francisco boating community after the transition is complete. In recent months, we have made tremendous strides

toward implementing a computerized cost tracking system in the budget, and in revamping our bar and clothing sales operation. We have expanded social programs, such as the "3rd Friday" dinners, and added the "Chili-and-a-Movie" series. We have expanded our racing program to include guest boats in the Summer Series, and by the time you read this, we will have concluded our initial Winter Race Series. During the coming summer racing season, TIYC's schedule will be the focal point of multihull racing for the San Francisco Bay area. Further, we have completed the initial steps necessary to get the Bridge linked by e-mail so that important issues can be discussed without waiting for the monthly meeting to come around.

The new **libe** is therefore more than a cosmetic change. It is a tangible reminder of our confidence that Treasure Island Yacht Club is here to stay, and that we will continue to be an organization whose burgee you can be proud to fly.

FROM THE VICE COMMODORE



As TIYC is very rapidly approaching a major milestone in its history I thought this might be a good time to review a few of the items from the Building Fund plan. The following are excerpts from the letter establishing the Building Fund. This letter was originally published on 24 Sep-

tember 1994, and was republished and clarified in May 1996.

"The TIYC Building fund has been established for the purpose of accumulating capital for the exclusive use of expanding the present Club or construction of a new facility...

All proceeds will be held in escrow until the liquidation of the Club... the merger or consolidation with another club... or the failure to commence improvements by 1 January, 1999...


Those current members choosing not to participate in the Building Fund program will maintain Regular Membership status in TIYC through the end of the fiscal year the aforementioned transition conditions become effective. Those former members may re-apply for membership, subject to the

conditions established for all new members at the time."

Several inquiries have been received recently from members who mistakenly believed that they would be able to make a "catch-up" payment at the last minute if it appeared that TIYC would survive the transition. As it becomes more apparent that the Club will not only survive, but will be able to expand and prosper in the post-Navy era, some members have asked about whether they could be reinstated in the Building Fund.

The Bridge is undertaking a detailed mid-year budget review, and will factor in the feasibility of offering an amnesty period, during which members who are not currently participating in the Building Fund may be offered an opportunity to buy back into the fund, and thus avoid a hefty initiation fee after the Club reorganizes this summer. In fairness to members who have participated, the amnesty offer being considered would take into account the time-value of funds which others have committed since 1994. I will report to you the results of the budget review as soon as it is completed.

Len Cardoza is new TIYC Staff Engineer








Join us for the second installment of TIYC's newest "old tradition"
