There was an inference that he felt we should be in our clubhouse. Mr. Carlson also told me that they expected to get a signed lease from the Navy in the next week or so giving them authority to issue licenses to island properties. When they get the lease he would look into what could be done to give us some help.

This past Wednesday, Harlan and I attended the monthly meeting of the Task Force. We approached Mr. Carlson and started the whole story over again with much the same results. He knows us and the problems of the past and he would see what he can do to get us some help.

We also had a very brief discussion with Larry Florin of the Mayor's office and he pretty much repeated what we had just heard from Dale.

At this same meeting, at John Miller's suggestion, we met a Mr. Redmond Kerman. Mr. Kerman is a developer who intends to submit an RFP for the future development of TI. In our discussion, we learned that he has already started to develop his plan and it includes a yacht club. He asked that if he was the successful bidder would the Treasure Island Yacht Club have an interest in being that yacht club? We responded that we had a very definite interest and would stay in touch with him as the RFP progresses.

Now after having said all of this I cannot help but to wonder, have we heard this song before, ;just that this time we have a new singer? I do not think there is any additional information that we have not already heard. We will keep with it until we find our way home again.

CLUB MEETINGS

In the absence of our clubhouse the Board will continue to hold the monthly Bridge/Board meetings. These meetings will probably be held alternately between the Oakland Yacht Club the Berkeley Yacht Club or a Bridge/Board Members home. Even though there is not a lot of activity right now there is a need to keep all Bridge/Board Members and the membership as informed and up to date as possible as to the club status.

Also because we do not have a meeting place we will try to have a social gathering on alternate sides of the bay semi monthly for the sake of keeping everyone informed and maintaining the sociality of the club. If all goes according to plan the Jibe and the social gatherings will alternate so that every month some information will be available.


