



NOTES FROM THE COMMODORE

HAPPY NEW MILLENIUM!

s you read this we should be through the Holidays and we'll all know whether or not the Y2K bug laid us all low or was just a minor hiccup – I'm betting on the latter. Since the weather has continued unseasonably warm the Bay has been open for business as usual, and

I hope that many of you were able to get in some time on the water in December. All in all it has been a wonderful holiday season and I hope that 2000 brings health, prosperity and happiness to each of you.

I also want to sincerely thank each of you for the vote of confidence you have extended me, and all of the other officers and directors of the Treasure Island Yacht Club in selecting us to guide the Club into the new year — one which will hopefully bring us back to a new, albeit temporary, facility at Clipper Cove.

Gail and I really enjoyed seeing so many of you at the December 10th dinner meeting at the Ballena Bay Yacht Club. They have a nice facility and extended us great hospitality. Their



landlord is Almar – who will be our new landlord at Treasure Island and it was good to learn from their Club officers that they have a good working relationship. That confirms my perceptions. In the 15 or so months that we have been dealing with Almar we have seen nothing but support

from them for our speedy return to Clipper Cove. Almar recognizes the value that a good yacht club brings to a marina; they want us back and recognize that TIYC's success can only help the Treasure Isle Marina to succeed.

Keith and Shirley Christianson have been in place as the TI Harbormasters since September. Both of them are extremely helpful and friendly. If you haven't already met them, be sure to stop in and introduce yourself the next time you are at Clipper Cove. My most recent visit with Keith was prompted by a phone call from him concerning the San Francisco Sailing Center and a possibility for us to use some of their facilities.

The SFSC is a non-profit corporation promoting small boat sailing. currently lease several thousand square feet of space at the Pier 12/Navy harbormaster's area about a quarter mile east of the current Marina. There are several small buildings on their site, including one that houses a 14' by 20' vacant office that could be made available for use by us for meetings. I had a cordial telephone conversation with the SFSC President, Paxton Davis, on the day after Christmas and I'll give a fuller report on this to the Bridge & Board when we meet at the Berkeley Yacht Club on January 4th. Suffice it to say that there are some obvious problems with the SFSC location and facilities which are problematic for us as a real interim solution to our homelessness problem - but there are some possibilities there also.

After the first of the year our immediate focus will be on discussions with the Delancy Street Found-ation for use of the major portion of Building 298 the shed next to the Crossroads Café. The eastern 3/4 of that building is currently unused. It is essentially raw open space with 15' by 45' dimensions. It would require some work investment on the Club's part, but it is adjacent to the Marina and the Crossroads Café as well as the portable heads and showers which should be installed in January. In addition, since it would not remove any existing parking spaces, it would likely be more acceptable to the City and County of San Francisco.

On a more fun note, there has been some fairly serious discussion among some of our members concerning a general invitation from the Sacramento Yacht Club to join them for the annual Sacramento Jazz Festival which takes place during the Memorial Day Weekend. I've thought of doing this many times over the years as I'm told that it is a fabulous weekend filled with fun and music. I suspect that this is in the process of turning into a cruise-out for the Club. It was on the Bridge & Board agenda at it's January meeting, and details are in this issue of the JIBE.

Finally, I hope everyone enjoyed dinner at the Ballena Bay Yacht Club on January the 14th. Staff Commodore Jim Aberer and the other officers and directors who are stepping down have expended tremendous efforts on behalf of TIYC and have brought the Club safely through the most trying period in it's history. It is altogether fitting that we recognize their fine efforts and set our sights toward the future.

To all, smoother sailing in the years ahead.



In an e-mail on Dec 24 they said they had made it to Tarpon Springs, after a nice cold rolling fast ride down the Florida coast.



TIYC 2000 CHANGE OF WATCH

In January the Treasure Island Yacht Club held it's Change of Watch to usher in Harlan Van Wye as our year 2000 Commodore.

There was a great turnout of members and guests at the event which was held at the Ballena Bay Yacht Club where awards and certificates were passed along to the incoming and outgoing TIYC Officers.

One of the hi-lights of the evening was we got to meet Shirley and Keith Christianson, who are Harbor Masters for the Treasure Isle Marina that is now part of the Almar Corporation.

After the Change of Watch, Commodore Van Wye sent an e-mail message to the membership and the following is part of that message:

Dear friends and club members:

Just a brief note to thank everyone for such a splendid time at the January 14th Change of Watch, and for turning out to honor so many of those who have brought us to a place where we stand a good chance of going home.

The number one priority on my watch will be to get us reestablished in temporary quarters at Clipper Cove. Beyond that are (1) ongoing monthly get-togethers, (2) increasing membership, (3) interaction with other clubs in the form of cruise-outs and cruise-ins (when we are reestablished at TI) and (4) resumption of some level of racing under the TI flag. Under the leadership of Kent Brewer we will also be engaged in long-range facilities planning, George Knies will be maintaining our links with YRA and the Coast Guard, and Art Eggers, Edie Penton and Christa Schreiber will help keep us active and known in the PICYA.

Assuming that we are successful in negotiating a lease for the eastern 3/4ths of Building 298 with the Delancy Street Foundation, we will be

confronted with turning a 15' X 45' raw space into a temporary clubhouse. At a minimum we will need to repaint the exterior, install at least two new windows and one new door, lay a new floor and sheetrock and paint the interior. We may also need to upgrade the building's electrical capacity and do some plumbing work. Some of this work might be done by DSF workers, but some will be done by TIYC. Please think about your personal connections vis-a-vis access to necessary labor and materials. How can you help the Club? The House Committee consists of myself, Jim Aberer and George Knies -let us know.

Also, for any aspiring architects or interior designers, think about the furnishings we have in storage and come up with a plan for utilizing them within a 15' X 45' space -- remembering that heads and showers will be furnished by the Marina in an adjacent portable building and that beyond a possible microwave and popcorn machine, cooking/restaurant facilities will be housed in DSF's adjacent Crossroads Cafe.



Explore the web sites of other yacht clubs, both local and distant. Get some ideas as to what we should have on ours. Anyone out there with experience in creating and/or operating a site, or with good connections in this area? I hope to appoint an Internet committee soon—any volunteers?

Lastly, our next dinner meeting will be on the third Friday of February (the 18th) at the Ballena Bay Yacht Club. Joyce will have a flyer in the mail shortly.

Now I really will shut up, after reminding you all of the wonderful and unselfish work of our JIBE editor Harry McBain. I'm sure Harry would welcome any contributions.


