COMMODORE'S NOTES

I have again delayed writing my notes this month for as long as I could in hopes of giving you the absolute latest update of what is happening with your Club and the situation on Treasure Island. To meet our regular end-of-month publication date, here it is Monday, November 27th, and all the news that can fit in print.

This meeting is the subject of a more elaborate discussion in Vice Commodore Brewer's notes, but suffice it to say, it is my opinion that everything went quite well and there do not appear to be any insurmountable obstacles to our

converting the Building for Clubhouse use.

DECEMBER'S DINNER AND MEETING

Elsewhere in this issue of the *Jibe* you will find some particulars concerning our December dinner and meeting. It promises to be a fine mid-holiday get together as well as a necessary meeting of the Corporation to conduct some important business-in particular, selecting the Club's leadership for next year. We have some important decisions to make concerning the clubhouse, and we really need to have as much input from the membership as possible.

THE CLUBHOUSE (a/k/a BUILDING 298)

As you all know by now, at the Treasure Island Development Authority's September 13th meeting in City Hall the Authority's governing board voted unanimously to authorize its staff to enter into "sole source" negotiations with the Treasure Island Yacht Club for lease of the space in Building 298 that we propose to turn into an interim clubhouse pending the final build-out of the new marina. This vote was of utmost significance to our Club's immediate future.

We are still working to finalize plans for the remodeling of Building 298 with the City's Department of Building Inspection (DBI), but we are moving actively forward to get all of the "I's" dotted and "T's" crossed. Kent Brewer, Jim Aberer, Christa Schreiber and I met with City representatives at Building 298 on

This past month I spent a week hearing cases in Ventura County and was away for the Thanksgiving holidays at Gail's brother's home in San Luis Obispo County. As a result, I have been playing telephone-tag with Dave Gogna from DBI and Steve Proud, the Mayor's Treasure Island Development Director. We are seeking to move the plans forward toward final approval and to get some costing information (i.e., proposed rent, etc.) which is obviously important for our budgetary planning. (In this regard, Commodore Aberer has propounded a list of seven questions or areas of concern which will undoubtedly be discussed at our December meeting.)

On Wednesday, November 15th, while in Ventura, I had an extremely cordial lunch with Randy Short from ALMAR. I stressed that we were in this for the long haul and would work closely with ALMAR so as not to trigger any unnecessary costs for them as Marina Randy indicated that their operators. development process is ongoing, and that there is a massive amount of background work necessary before the first pier is installed. I sense that we may be in temporary quarters for guite awhile-but that's OK. We just need to get in there. To this end I received substantial assurances that we will be able to work out appropriate financial arrangements for access to the Marina's bathrooms and showers, again, a necessary element of our remodeling plans... Finally, I learned that for the time being the

Treasure Isle Marina would be staffed as an outpost of ALMAR's Ballena Isle Marina in Alameda.

I remain very optimistic with regard to our return to Clipper Cove by the Spring of 2001. We have come too far now to turn back, and I am really looking forward to the day when the Commodore's Notes can be used to solicit volunteers for cleaning and painting details at the new clubhouse!

RANDOM NOTES



We will also have to begin "ramping-up" for the inevitable costs associated with a permanent facility leased from ALMAR beginning about three or four years from now.

TIYC'S VICE COMMODORE

Most all of you know that representatives of your Bridge and Board have held meetings with the City and County of San Francisco, and have engaged the services of an architect in an effort to obtain

approval to both lease and develop Building 298 as a temporary clubhouse. Building 298 is the shed, comprised of a space approximately 45' by 15', which sits adjacent to our former clubhouse and the current Cross Roads Café. By planning approval prior to this point we were given "sole source negotiation" status, thus if we can meet the costs and conditions required for the development, we can rent the premises. There are no competitors for this space. Our progress to date, and the anticipated obstacles still to be overcome, are summarized as follows:

June 7,2000: An inspection accomplished by the Special Projects Team of the City and County of San Francisco, Building Inspection Department, focused upon Plumbing, Electrical, Building and Handicap Access issues, generated a report which we then took to our architect. Robert Greenlee:

August 2, 2000: The architect's preliminary plans were submitted to David Gogna of the City's Department of Building Inspection (DBI);

August 4, 2000: The DBI responded with comments as to the architect's plans, including various questions relative to how the proposed construction would meet various building code conditions, and further highlighted various codes provisions specific to the Americans with Disabilities Act:

October 11, 2000: Revised architectural plans were submitted to the DBI, providing answers to all questions raised.

October, 2000: Representatives of the Mayor's Office, Treasure Island Project, identified for us the need to have an on site inspection by Richard Skaff, Deputy Director - Physical Accessibility, of the Mayor's Office on Disability. Mr. Skaff is himself disabled, requiring a motorized wheelchair;

November 9, 2000: An on site inspection was conducted, with the following representatives of TIYC present: Commodore Harlan Van Wye, Vice Commodore R. Kent Brewer, Staff Commodore James Aberer, and Board of Directors member Christa Schreiber. Also present were Richard Skaff from the Mayor's Office on Disability: Stephen Proud, Director of Development for the Treasure Island Project; and Robert Mahoney, Facilities Manager for the Treasure Island Project. To our surprise, Mr. Skaff had not yet seen the proposed plans. They were reviewed generally with him, during which we learned that there is a very specific check list procedure which his office demands be submitted through him before any final approval can be given by the Department of Building Inspection. We also pressed for cost information relative to the indicated rental, which has been promised but is not yet in hand.

Assuming that our proposed club house would meet all provisions of the building code addressing handicap issues, which we firmly believe it will, the position of the Mayor's Office on Disability is that they will not approve any project which involves a "program" requiring access to our proposed club through the existing marina facility since the existing marina facility does not comply with the American's with Disability Act (ADA) requirements. The key here is the word "program". We can have a club house. We can invite the public. We can hold meetings. We can use the club house essentially for anything we want. What we can not do is invite the public to our club via water access since such an activity would constitute a "program" necessitating accessing us via the presently non-ADA compliant marina. It is financially impossible for the Marina to achieve compliance with the disability requirements with respect to the present facilities. The build out would be in compliance.

On 11/20/00 the Club Board of Directors met to consider the above, reaching the conclusion that we should go forward with the site planning, cost evaluation, and other conditions of developing the space into a club house so that the membership can consider the feasibility and cost of a club house which would meet the City's conditions. The next step involves a review by the architect of the new forms and new conditions required for the site plan approval process. The architect has just relocated to Key Largo, Florida, thus any further plan reviews will need to be conducted in his absence, but we have been assured that such is not an obstacle.

As a personal observation, it is my opinion that the conditions imposed by the Mayor's Office on Disability do not preclude the club from holding many of the activities ordinary to a yacht club; we would be constrained to a significant degree. For example, membership meetings and meals could occur with access of members by vehicle. If TIYC was to host a race, we could not start or finish the race in the marina, nor could boats participating in the race which were not berthed at Treasure Island come back to the docks so that crew members could join us in the club, unless the accomplished such access without going through the marina docks. Such travel to the club could, however, be done by car, a method used extensively in every race by crews who wish to take their boats back to their home docks before attending the club function. Similarly, TIYC could sponsor a cruise in, but not with the boats seeking to bring their crew members to the club via the marina docks. They would have to anchor in open water and access the shore in a method other than over or through the marina facilities. Cruise outs would not be prohibited with respect to boats berthed at TI since these slip holders already hold the right to access their boats to come and go. TIYC boats not berthed at TI would not rendezvous at TI first anyway. Lastly, visiting boats could rent an open berth for \$15 per night, qualifying them to use the docks and thus access to us.

We will keep you posted. Once we have the cost information and plan approval we will be presenting the entirety of the plans and cost information to the membership for approval. Meanwhile, the plans prepared to date are available for inspection by anyone who wishes to see them and your Bridge and Board will stand ready to answer any questions about the plan approval process you might have.

Remember, also that when we send out additional mailers encouraging participation, it costs you money from our limited treasury.

This past year your board has worked diligently to keep a high profile throughout the boating community. Thanks to the efforts of people like Christa Schreiber attending all of the PICYA meetings throughout Northern California, we are still thought of as a viable Bay Area yacht club.


