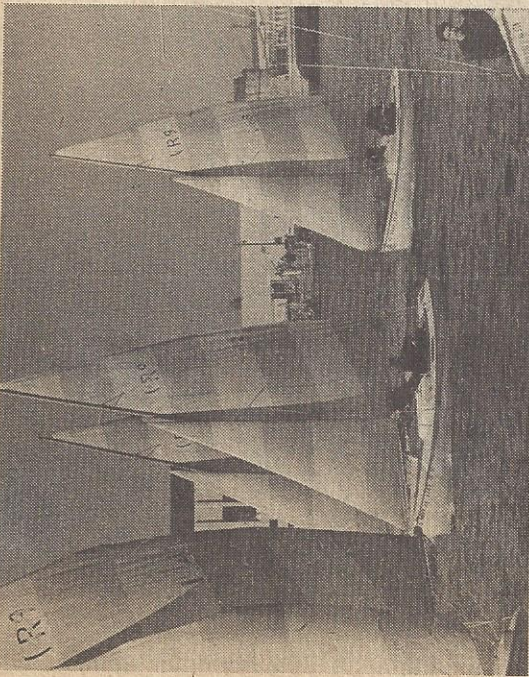


T I Sailing Club Outraces Mare Islanders

In team racing, a team consists of three boats on each side. Scores of all three boats are aggregated for each race and compared with the scores of opposing team's three boats.

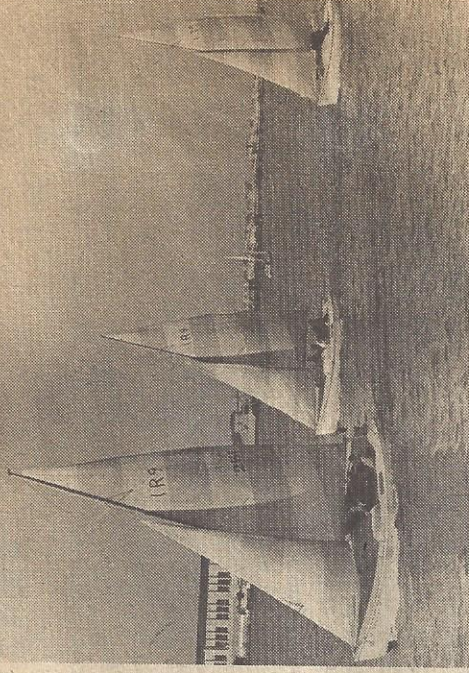
Five races were held in the T.I. Cove on 3 November to determine the winning club. Capt Fiske's effort were backed up by the solid performance of T.I. skippers John Harrison (TISC Commodore), Tony Soltys (Team Captain and TISC Racing Commodore), Karl Urbach and Arlene Ameigh (TISC Cruising Commodore).

The depth of racing skill and enthusiasm of the Treasure Island Club can be attributed to the considerable racing opportunities available to club members.

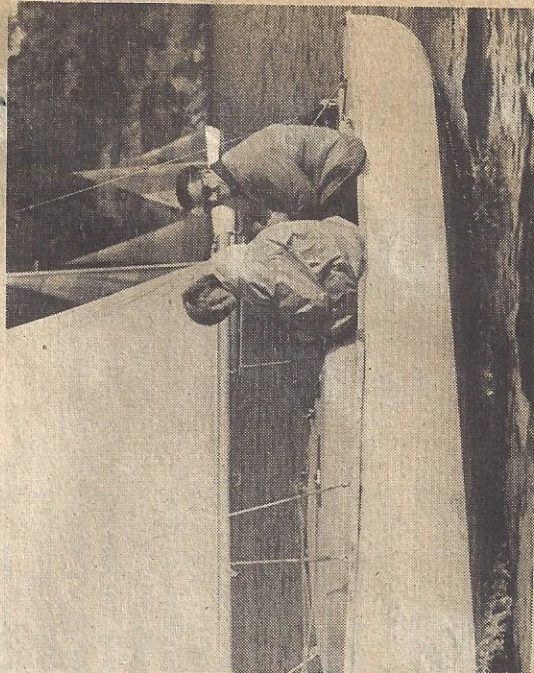
These include Read Cup Matches against visiting British Naval ships, Van Arsdall races, NPSSA Match Races, SF Bay SYRA and Mid-Winter series, and frequent club races.
