Charitable Foundation

Treasure Island Yacht Club is recognized as a 501(c)(7) entity, which grants it non-profit status. However, a (c)(7) entity is not a charitable organization which can accept gifts (and allow the donor to take a tax deduction for the gift). TIYC could organize a companion organization which would have the status of a charity 501(c)(3) status, which could accept tax deductible gifts. However, the proceeds from such gifts could not be diverted for most club business but instead would have to go to a charitable purpose, such as promoting recreational sailing. Also, there would be considerable paperwork associated with maintaining such an entity and additional administrative costs in record keeping, submission of reports, etc.

The Bridge and Board will be asked to put the issue of forming a 501(c)(3) entity on the agenda for the annual meeting in November. Please think about questions, possible relevant issues and how each of you should vote should the issue be put to the question.

This Streamline Moderne “Administration Building” (Building One) has served through the years as the administrative center for the Golden Gate International Exposition (GGIE), a terminal and ticketing office for Pan American Airways, and headquarters for the Twelfth Naval District.
